Chairperson's Report 2011

Welcome to the first annual report of the SPACE NZ Trust. It is wonderful to report on the continuing success and development of SPACE, even in these difficult financial times.

It has been a fantastic achievement by the Hutt Playcentre Association to create and develop SPACE to point where it is a nationally, and even internationally, recognised programme. But it became apparent in recent years that a Playcentre Association is not the ideal vehicle to carry the burden of governing a rapidly evolving programme like SPACE. So, after considering various options, the SPACE NZ Trust was created on 20 October 2010. Winston Churchill might have called this the end of the beginning.

Since then the six initial trustees have been busy implementing the new structure. This has included housekeeping matters like registering with the Charities Commission, taking over the assets and operation of SPACE, employing staff, and confirming the funding arrangements. A manual of governance policies and management procedures is also being created.

However, the most important task has been learning about each other and how to work together using our wide range of skills and experience. We carried out a strategic planning exercise earlier in the year. The financial sustainability of SPACE is an important focus, and we have several exciting options to strengthen this and develop into new areas.

A major feature of SPACE is collaboration. It is not just a component of the programme and how the Trust forms partnerships with other organisations, but is reflected in the internal teamwork that has made SPACE the tremendous success that it now is. We are very grateful to our manager Leanne Dawson for the

hard work and skill she has brought to reorganising the team under the trust umbrella, and ensuring there was no interruption to the assistance provided to those who deliver the programme nationwide. The Trust is now supporting Leanne as she undertakes a Graduate Diploma in Not-for-profit Management at Unitec. This is particularly useful because it includes assignments focussing directly on the work she is doing for the trust.

Thank you very much to all our supporters, staff, partner organisations, and everyone who is working so well to implement our vision of "SPACE in every place".

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The SPACE programme was originally designed, developed and delivered within the Hutt Playcentre Association in 2003. Following the successful establishment of the programme in the Hutt Valley, the programme was then launched nationwide to Playcentre Associations and other community organisations. In October 2010, the SPACE NZ Trust was formed to act as the governing body of SPACE. SPACE NZ Trust is a not-for-profit organisation and is registered with the Charities Commission.

The vision of the Trust is:

SPACE in every place

Our purpose is to:

- Provide communities across Aotearoa/New Zealand with access to SPACE.
- Strengthen families/ whānau through the provision of quality parenting support and early childhood experiences for infants.

We aim to:

- Support families and communities so that every child has the opportunity to thrive.
- Promote the family as being central to a community's well-being.
- Have SPACE programmes accessible to all New Zealanders through collaborative partnerships with national and local organisations.

National team

Under the new SPACE NZ Trust structure, the national team has flourished. This structure has provided the team with strategic direction and the ability to explore and collaborate with a diverse range of organisations that support SPACE, both locally and nationally.

SPACE Partners

The number of SPACE partners delivering the SPACE programme has risen to 25. There has been an increase in the number of programmes being delivered, currently standing at 115. Nationally, 299 programmes have been completed since 2003. There continues to be a steady growth and interest in the programme as organisations recognise the benefits and successful outcomes the programme offers their communities.

The SPACE national team has worked diligently to develop a range of resources to support partners setting up and delivering the programme.

For example, in collaboration with TessaRose Productions, the national team has produced the *Swinging Stars*, *Rocking Rockets* CDs, and *Guide* as a music resource for SPACE facilitators and SPACE parents.

The national team has also thoroughly revised the *SPACE Curriculum-Facilitators Journey*. This has been distributed to facilitators and has been well received. Updated brochures, leaflets, flags, and other promotional material have also been produced.

Improvements have been made to the Treasure Baskets, including Treasure Basket cards to provide a better quality product for SPACE partners and a revised promotional DVD has been produced to better reflect the diversity of SPACE delivery.

The SPACE website has been upgraded to include access to the Management and Operations on-line. We have also begun implementing

some initial changes to the website to simplify site navigation for parents and SPACE partners.

The team continue to be responsive in the development and sourcing of new resources that will support our SPACE partners.

Over 1400 parents and babies are currently attending SPACE programmes across new Zealand. Approximately 3800 parents and babies have participated in SPACE since 2003.

Future Directions

Currently, there are a number of really exciting prospects ahead. To ensure success in future endeavours the Trust has worked hard to finalise a strategic direction that focuses on the establishment and strengthening of sustainable structures for local and regional partnering models.

We would like to use these models to increase the number of SPACE partners delivering SPACE throughout New Zealand.

One such model is the potential development of a Family SPACE programme. This aims to benefit working parents, provide an opportunity for families to attend together with their infants, and more specifically to involve fathers.

The national team is also investigating some innovative funding models that engage local businesses to support SPACE in their region. The team is also designing a specialised database to incorporate a range of components such as; training data, SPACE participants, and a donation element.

Finally, the national team will continue to develop the quality national facilitator training programme.
